Richard L. Carrico

We are pleased to announce that Richard Carrico, historian and author will be our featured speaker for this April's installment of the Speaker Series.

Richard L. Carrico, long time back country resident who now lives in Warner Springs, will be making a presentation on the long and colorful history of the wines and wineries of San Diego County. Richard is a professor of American Indian Studies at San Diego State University and a Life Member of the Ramona Pioneer Society.

Always an engaging and educational speaker, Richard's lecture will be based on his recently released book "Of Wine on the Lees Well Refined: A History of the Wineries of San Diego County."

The book and the presentation spans more than 240 years from the origin of San Diego wines at Mission San Diego in the late 1700s to the contemporary wine scene. Little known facts will be divulged such as at one time San Diego County had more wineries than Sonoma or Napa; Indian labor formed the backbone of the early 1900s wine industry here; the first commercial winery was in Valley Center, and North County played a major role in the early development of wines in the county. Did you know that some historians think wine even played a role in the defeat of General Kearny at the Battle of San Pasqual? Or that one of the most popular and award winning wineries was in Vista?
