My Dear Sir,

It became my most painful duty, (at the request of the immediate family,) to announce to you the death of your worthy brother, Lieut. Col. George H. Ruggold U.S.A. who expired at his residence in this city, on Monday the 4<sup>th</sup> inst at 3 1/2 P.M. after an exceedingly severe and painful illness of one week, produced by congestion of the liver.

Col. Ruggold leaves behind him a large circle of devoted friends, to whom he had endeared himself by his many virtues, acts of kindness and benevolence. His loss is not only a great private bereavement but will be felt by the public generally, and perhaps no one will be missed or regretted more by the community than your estimable brother with whom I have had the happiness, as well as my family of being upon the closest terms of intimacy for more than nine years, and to this time I shall ever revert with no small degree of pleasure - We have the consolation to know that during his illness every attention which medical skill and filial affection could bestow were freely lavished upon him -

He has however passed away full of honors and an abiding faith in the mercy and love of his Creator.

His funeral was numerously attended

by Regular Army Officers, Soldiers and friends, forming  
a cortege imposing and solemn - Grand mass for the an-  
nihil of his soul was chanted at St. Mary's Cathedral  
and the customary military honors done to his body  
at the reception vault of Calvary Cemetery where
