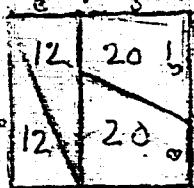

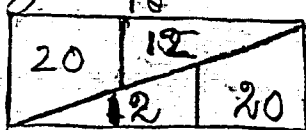

ping, unless it can be done  
cheap. I will be in need
