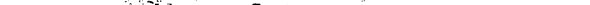

That Thomas Whaley, now deceased, was at the time of making his last will and testament, hereinafter set forth, and at the time of his death, a resident of the City of New York, and was among other property, seized in fee simple and possessed of the following described premises, viz :

First.—All that certain lot of land, with the building thereon erected, situated in the City of New York, and bounded and containing as follows, to wit : Beginning at a point on the westerly side of Mott Street, distant forty-one feet ten inches northerly from the corner formed by the intersection of the westerly side of Mott Street with the northeasterly side of Worth Street, running thence northerly along Mott Street, twenty-two feet eight inches ; thence westerly at right angles to Mott Street, or nearly so, fifty-one feet one inch ; thence southerly and parallel with Mott Street, or nearly so, twenty-two feet four inches and one-half of an inch, to Worth Street ; thence southeasterly along Worth Street, five inches ; and thence easterly at right angles to Mott Street, or nearly so, fifty-one feet, to the place of beginning, being now known as Number Three (3) Mott Street.

The plaintiffs further allege, that the said Rachel Whaley, became executrix of the said last will and testament, and as such executrix and otherwise received various sums of money belonging to the estate of said Thomas Whaley, deceased, and thereafter invested a portion of the same in the purchase of the lot hereafter described, viz :

Second.
