## CONDITIONS.

The within goods are shipped and received, subject to the following conditions:

If the consignee or owner of the goods, package by package, as discharged, then the Company may deliver them to the wharfinger or any other party or person, believed by said Company to be responsible, and who will take charge of said goods and pay the freight on the same. The responsibility of said Company shall cease immediately on the delivery of the said goods from the ship's tackle. The steamer on which the within goods are carried shall have leave to tow and assist vessels; to sail with or without pilots; to tranship to any other of the Company's steamers or steamers employed by said Company; to lighter from steamer to steamer, or from steamer to shore; to deliver to other steamers, companies, persons, or forwarding agents any of the within goods destined for ports or places at which the said Company's vessel on which they are carried does not call. The Company shall not be held responsible for any damage or loss resulting from fire at sea or in port, accidents to or from machinery, boilers, or steam, or any other accident, or dangers of the seas, rivers, roadsteads, harbors, or of sail or steam navigation of what nature or kind soever.

It is expressly understood that the said Company shall not be liable or accountable for weight, leakage, breakage, shrinkage, rust, loss, or damage arising from insecurity of package or damage to cargo by vermin, burning, or explosion of articles on freight or otherwise, or loss or damage on account of inaccuracy or omission in marks or descriptions, effects of climate, or from unavoidable detention or delay; nor for loss of specie, bullion, bank notes, government notes, bonds, or consols, jewelry, or any property of special value, unless shipped under its proper title or name, and extra freight paid thereon.

On delivery of the goods within enumerated, as provided herein, this receipt shall stand canceled, whether surrendered or not.

It is expressly agreed that all claim against the G. N. P. S. S. Co., or any of the stockholders of said Company, for damage to or loss of any of the within merchandise, must be presented to the Company within one year from date hereof; and that after one year from date hereof, no action, suit, or proceeding, in any court of justice, shall be brought against said G. N. P. S. S. Co., or any of the stockholders thereof, for any damage to or loss of said merchandise; and the lapse of said year shall be deemed a conclusive bar and release of all right to recover against said Company, or any of the stockholders thereof, for any such damage or loss.

with the following conditions. That the Atchison, Topeka  
and Santa Fe Railroad Company, or its Representative, is to  
construct, fully complete, equip and operate, twenty miles  
of Railroad eastwardly, starting from the Bay of San Diego,  
within one year from and after the first day of January 1880.  
In case of a failure on the part of said grantee to  
fully comply with the foregoing conditions, said deed to  
be returned to the grantor.

gence in not writing before, but  
one thing and another has occupied  
my time besides having considerable  
trouble that I have not yett felt.

I now thank you for your com-  
munications and express my ap-  
plication that notwithstanding the  
lapse of so many years since last meet-  
ing, my wife and I are still remem-  
bered by friends and estimable  
friends. But the many changes



that have taken place during this  
long interim! As regards myself  
the scales of fortune have turned, and  
I am down, away down in the  
balance having lost nearly everything.  
Reverses of various kinds have over-  
taken me, dating back many years  
during the greater portion of which  
time my family (wife & 5 children)  
have subsisted on some degree of distress  
except from them for more than 6 yrs  
have lead a most miserable existence  
in this city with the exception of a  
few months in the winter of 1876 spent  
with them.

I came on here in 1870 hoping  
to make something from my father's  
estate from which I expected to  
make considerable - But the  
consequence of the great depresi-

ation in real estate owing to the  
panic, the rascality of lawyers and  
the length of time which elapsed  
and various other causes I real-  
ized very little indeed.

I determined to remain here  
hoping to get into business of some  
kind sufficiently remunerative  
to warrant sending for my family  
but I have made most miser-  
able failure of it and today I am  
about as completely worn out as it  
is possible for a man to be. ~~My~~  
~~my~~ wife and children are suffering  
~~from~~ without shoes to their feet  
for sufficient food always to eat.

This is a most deplorable ~~con-~~  
dition for to be in. Still I am not  
without hope looking forward to  
better times to come.

I have some property in San  
Luis - on the house when  
we arrived - but everything is  
so exceedingly dull that ~~we~~ <sup>we believe</sup> ~~it is~~ <sup>it would be</sup>

year past, but of nothing  
can be done in San Francisco  
yet. I thought I would take  
my family to S. F. and try to  
return here when I believe I  
have some funds remaining  
who will ~~be~~ <sup>be</sup> ~~likely~~ <sup>likely</sup> to help  
me - but at no time have  
I had funds sufficient to  
do this -

I have shown you letters in the  
past (please excuse the re-  
ference) unhesitatingly I ap-  
ply to you to ~~offer me some~~

if you can do so without in-  
convenience. One hundred  
dollars will be of the greatest  
possible use to me at the

San Diego, but shall re-  
move there with barely a dollar  
in my pocket and probably  
get away again should it be

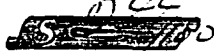

I received yours of 27<sup>th</sup> by last mail. I am surprised that you have been unable to find anything to do in San Francisco for I supposed you had something quite certain before you decided to leave N.Y., but I expect times are harder on this coast than in the East.

In regard to the Conklin suit - a few days ago Conklin came to me and said "Mr Winder has had a letter from Mr Whaley about this matter as he wants to be as easy as he can and he has agreed we to take off ten dollars" I replied "the fee paid our own lawyer was a fair five & I am paying more."

You observe "I have no doubt (from the way Winder writes) that Conklin will do whatever is just & right to all parties" - if you had known the man you would have said no such thing.

The trial of the suit has been postponed several times owing to the absence of the judge & it was to have come off last week & now my attorney Cleveland has gone to San Francisco to be gone 3 or 4 weeks, so it will not now come off till

lotter. We expect to cut him down to \$75<sup>00</sup> at least and with a possibility of beating him entirely on a deskivator. He don't remedy it before the trial. But I will have to pay my lawyer \$20 or \$75<sup>00</sup> for that suit. The whole affair has been very vexatious as well as costly in time & money.

You think the judgement against you & the sale of your property under it - the property you conveyed to Frank & myself - were illegal. It was all done in accordance with law as interpreted by the best lawyers here - it is a rascally law made by lawyers for their especial benefit. And the people are fools enough to send rascally lawyers to the legislature to make just such laws.

Your case is a hard one and I sincerely wish I could help you still further God knows I would if I could. You do not know what a terrible calamity you have brought upon me, you may never know, I do not really think you intended to wrong me but ~~the law~~ I will say no more now for you are in need & suffering and if you were my bitterest enemy I would assist you if I could. I presume you will misunderstand me - I can't help it - but some day, here or hereafter it will be clear.

There are rumors in the air and otherwise that other times will soon dawn upon San Diego caused by railroad who here, some people place great faith in these rumors, but ~~there is no basis for them yet.~~ I am chairman of the Executive Committee <sup>in California</sup> of the business men of San Diego. We have sent a agent east to negotiate with Railroad Co. to ~~commence~~ work here & are working earnestly but as quietly as possible keeping every bit of the papers, and have strong hopes of success, but of course may fail as we have have so many times before. If successful then of course you will needs be here - but now I can see no possible opening for you - the two banks consolidating, for lack of business enough for two, throws out of employment two and perhaps 3 men. A friend of mine from the East who is an educated man, first class salesman, excellent photographer, acquainted with tools, first class character for integrity & industry offered himself at \$30<sup>00</sup> a month at any service even to driving a team, but could find no work & has gone to raising eggs & chickens and keeps his expenses within \$5<sup>00</sup> a month. Frank told me he had two places offered him in S.F. before he went up. I will write a letter to a friend of mine & will write to him also. Yours E. V. Mone

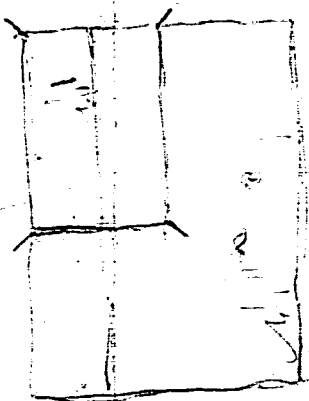
