WHO SYMPATHIZE WITH THE SICK AND SUFFERING:

In order that you may thoroughly understand the aims of the "Hospital of the Good Samaritan," the following is submitted to you, with the earnest request that you carefully read it.

Petition presented to the City Trustees:

To the President and Board of Trustees of the Uity of San Diego—Your petitioners respectfully represent: That the city of San Diego, with a large and growing population, and an extensive territory tributary to it, possesses no public hospital, and, indeed, no hospital of any kind, to which physicians can send their patients, or in which those who are sick or injured can receive proper medical attendance, nursing and attention. Our sick and surgical patients must now be kept in hotels, lodging-houses or private houses, at great expense, inconvenience or injury, or sent to hospitals elsewhere. The need of a hospital here at this time is urgent and imperative.

After a careful consideration of this matter, and consultation with our leading physicians, we have decided to establish and maintain a hospital at this place if can secure a lease of the necessary ground from your honorable body. The expense incident to the inauguration of this enterprise, which is purely charitable, will be so great that we cannot afford sufficient money for the purchase of the land required, at the present high prices. The hospital should be located where it can be conveniently reached by physicians, patients and their friends. We believe that we can secure the necessary

funds for this purpose, if the use of the land can be granted to us.

We pledge ourselves to conduct this hospital in the interests of suffering humanity, and to exspend every cent realized from it, after paying the necessary expenses, in the improvement and enlargement of the hospital. Nothing will be paid to any one who is not actually in the institution. All patients and candidates for admission will be placed upon an equal footing, regardless of nationality or creeds. There will be no physician upon the Board of Managers, and patients will be permitted to select their own physicians and schools of practice. We hope in the near future to secure endowed beds for the benefit of those who are unable to pay. Our aim will be to do the greatest good to the greatest number, and to manage this institution in the broadest and most liberal and charitable manner.

In conclusion, we pray your honorable body to grant us a lease of about five to twenty acres of land in the public park, for the term of twenty years, for hospital purposes, upon the condition that we shall erect a hospital thereon within a reasonable time, and that when the premises are no longer used for this purpose they may revert to the city. As soon as this lease is granted we will incorporate, proceed to raise the necessary funds, and push the work forward with all practicable speed.
