### Modes of Mesmerism.

The Mesmeriser, being seated opposite to, & a little higher than the patient, & having concentrated his thoughts on the business before him, may begin by placing his hand gently on the head of the other. After a few moments, he will draw it slowly down the forehead, from the fingers slightly separated, at the eyes, without touching them; & then make some passes downwards, at the distance of one or two inches <sup>eye</sup> above the face & chest to about as far as the pit of the stomach. On each occasion to raise the hand to repeat the movement, he must be careful to remove it by an easy sweep to the outside

or at least to lose the




