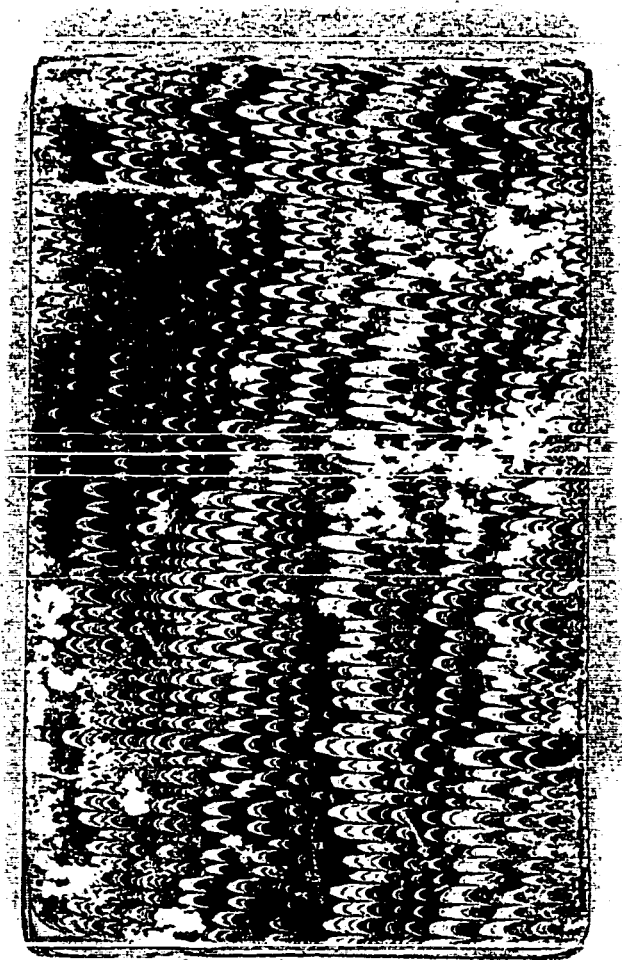

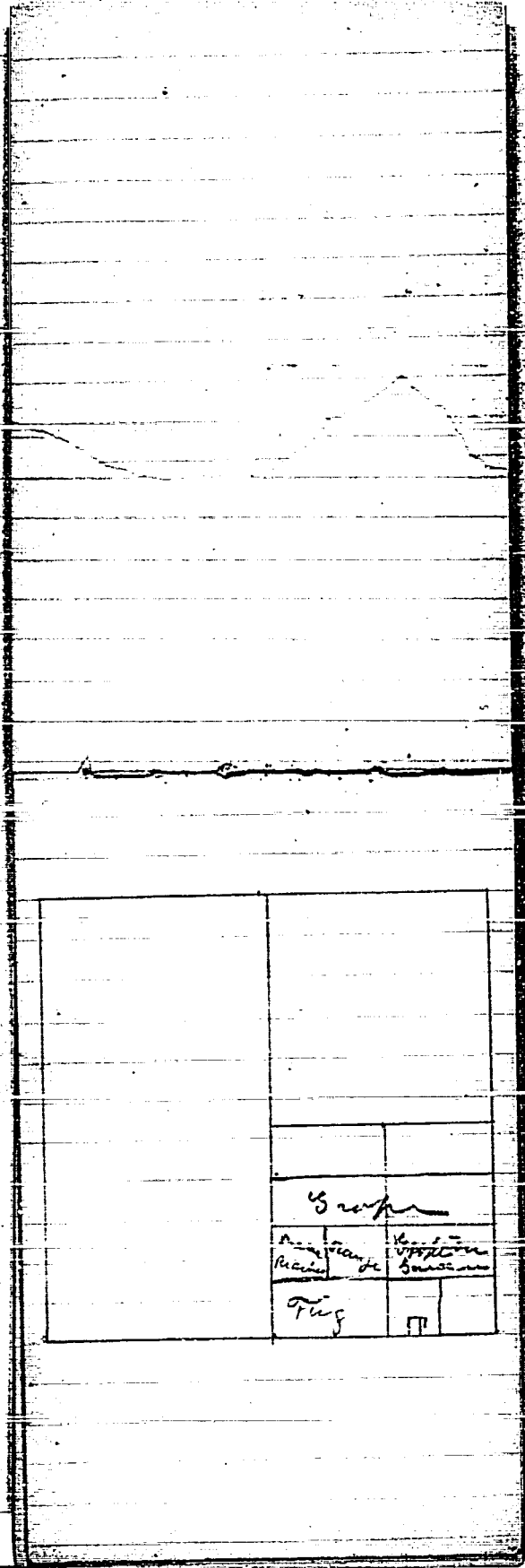

White Wash

$\frac{1}{2}$ bushel nice unslacked lime, slack with boiling water over to keep clean in; strain through sieve, add one peck of clean salt dissolved in warm water (pansons by), 3 lbs ground rice boiled to thin paste, strain in boiling hot; $\frac{1}{2}$ pound powerful Spanish whiting, and 1 pound clean blue which has been previously dissolved by soaking well, and then hanging it over a slow fire within another kettle to boil

of water; add five gallons of water to the mixture, stir it well and let it stand a few days covered from dirt. It should be put on a good hot fire.

will cover a square yard. Spanish brown will make red a pink according to quantity. Common clay mixed with Spanish brown before slaked in makes lilac. Lamp black Spanish brown mixed makes reddish stone, yell or ochre tinted in makes yellow wash, but chrome goes

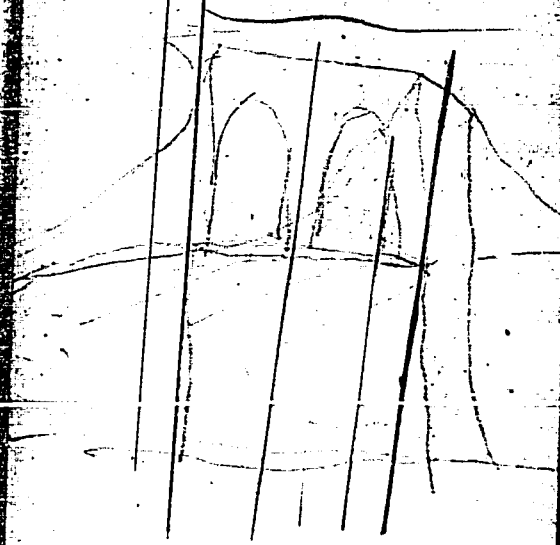
