



payment of freight at the rate of per ton, with five per cent.
primage and average. Cargo on deck at shipper's risk.

It is further stipulated, that in all cases of loss of such goods or merchandise, the amount
of claim and damage shall be restricted to the cash value of such goods or merchandise, at the
port of San Francisco, at the time of shipment; and that all claims for partial loss or
damage, shall be ascertained and adjusted upon the same basis of value.

In Witness Whereof, the master or Purser of said Steamer, hath signed these —
Bills of Lading, all of this tenor and date, one of which being accomplished, the others to
stand void. On obtaining the owner's, lighterman's, or dayman's receipt for said goods,
this Bill of Lading to be cancelled.
