WASHINGTON.

Special Dispatch to The San Diego Union.
The Louisiana Case Before the Elec-
toral Commission.

WASHINGTON, February 14. — The
Electoral Commission, yesterday, after
hearing arguments by McDonald,
Jenks, Horibout and Howe, adjourned
until five o'clock this evening, when
ex-Senator Matt Carpenter, of counsel
for the Democrats, made his argument
in behalf of the Tilden case. At seven
o'clock the Commission adjourned un-
til eleven this morning. It is thought
that the case will be finished to-day.

DIAZ NOW HAS UNDERSTOOD AWAY

Throughout the whole interior of
Mexico, and along the entire Pacific
coast of the country, except perhaps
at Acapulco; and the fact that both
war vessels are now under Diaz' con-
trol will secure the speedy submission
of that port also.

The state of affairs in the Republic
is disheartening in the extreme. The
Chiefs on either side — Lerdo and
Yglesias — having fled the country,
people who have been and interest are
forced to acquiesce in the military rule
of Diaz.

Those officers who (like Colonel
Machorro) cannot give their allegiance
to this usurpation, can only leave the
country; not being willing to prolong
what could only be guerrilla warfare.

Diaz being at the head of the only
organized force, and controlling the
army and navy, he for the present
appears, but it is believed by all
thoughtful citizens of Mexico that he
cannot establish a permanent gov-
ernment.

His rule of force must be short lived.
He may retain his grasp a few months,
but the end is inevitable. His govern-
ment can only be sustained by military
power; and an army must be paid.
The financial administration will break
down. The revenue needed to carry
on such a government cannot be raised
from the country, nor can it be
obtained from abroad. When the
funds doubtfully raised by contribu-
tions and forced loans are exhausted
the Diaz administration will fall in
pieces.

Some patriotic men of great influ-
ence are yet relied upon for the future.
Senor Ballarta, formerly Governor of
Jalisco, and General Ygnacio Mejia,
both very popular leaders, are looked
to in some quarters to heterize rally
the constitutional party of the country.

General business is of course greatly

pated in favor of our new business.

The disinfecting properties of chlorine
and tannin, as now being used in the
improved method of making leather,
are too well understood by the Health
Officer and others of the city authori-
ties, to require explanation here. It
is notable fact in the visitation of
Adiant cholera, yellow fever, smallpox,
&c., whenever these epidemics have
occurred that in tenement houses in
the immediate neighborhood of business,
the inmates have been entirely ex-
empt from the prevailing contagion.

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THE VOTE OF LOUISIANA.
Special Dispatch to The San Diego Union.
Proceedings of the Electoral Commission—The Commission on the Admissibility of Evidence—Two Hours on Each Side Allowed for Argument.
WASHINGTON, February 11.—On re-assembling this morning, the Electoral Commission heard the continuation of Matt. Carpenter's argument. He claimed that the Louisiana Returning Board had exceeded its power in assuming judicial functions; he also claimed that ten thousand votes had been disfranchised in Louisiana.

At the conclusion of Carpenter's argument a debate ensued on the question of the admissibility of evidence. Thurman favoring taking all the evidence at once and subsequently deciding as to its admissibility. Edmunds objected to such a course as involving a useless waste of time. Edmunds then submitted an order that counsel be heard on the whole subject, as the case now stands, and that four hours on each side be allowed for debate.

Miller objected, as that would leave the question of admissibility for after consideration. Abbott opposed mixing up the case. If the evidence was refused admission he desired to hear argument on what was left of the case. Thurman agreed with Abbott, and favored considering the evidence on both sides, as before, subject to future decision as to its admissibility.

Strong offered a substitute, giving counsel two hours on each side to argue on the admissibility of evidence. Thurman moved an amendment, making the time three hours. The

TROUBLE IN THE FRONTIER, AGAIN.

For two or three days rumors of a new revolution in the Lower California Frontier have been heard, but they could be traced to no definite source. Yesterday, however, facts came to hand showing a state of perfect anarchy below the line. Two citizens of San Diego who have been spending some time on the lower coast, arrived from the Frontier at a late hour night before last, bringing intelligence that Pedro Badillo, otherwise known as "Six-foot Pete," who was a strong partisan of the lately deposed Governor Villagrana, had organized a band and began to raid through the country to San Rafael. Beginning near Tijuana, Badillo's party went to the Bandini Rancho and other places, taking arms and horses, and proceeded on their march. Our informants met a portion of Badillo's force fifteen or twenty in number. They had a team belonging to Captain Eaton of this place, who is keeping a store at San Rafael, and had made the driver prisoner. These men would answer no questions, and were not allowed to converse by their officers. It was said that on the arrival of the party at San Rafael, Zotate, the municipal Judge, was arrested and imprisoned, with other parties, and Eaton's store was shot up. What else was done is unknown. It was also reported by people in the Frontier that a second party, of twenty-five or thirty men, also subject to Badillo's orders, had marched down the coast to cooperate with the main body. Several well known residents are said to have been treated with indignity by Badillo's band. The party on stopping at each rancho read a sort of proclamation, which set forth that for public uses, they were empowered to seize such horses, provisions, etc., as they might require. The proclamation did not seem to be noticed by any authority, having no responsible signature.

FURTHER PARTICULARS.
Since the foregoing was written we have received the following letter from a thoroughly reliable gentleman at Tijuana:
On Sunday evening last was commenced another revolution in Lower California. Pedro Badillo, who lives at Wild Cat, entered the house of Jose Maria Bandini at Tijuana and seized all the arms and fire arms on the ranch. He also visited the house of Ygnacio. The purpose of the uprising
