Some of the Advantages of Oceanside.

Occanside is the finest sea-side resort of the Southwest, and is situated on the line of a transcontinental railroad now almost fluished, and at the mouth of the San Luis Rey River, 42 miles from San Diego and 80 miles from San Bernardino, and 3 miles from the at-tractive old Mission of San Luis Rey.

It is the outlet for a large and productive country, which insures the ductive country, which insures the duilding up of one of the most pres-perous settlements in Southern California.

The bench is composed of clean sand, sloping gradually: the breakers are light; thus affording the finest surfathing inaginable, with very little, if any undertow. A beautiful drive of many miles up and down the beach is one of the many features of attraction at our resort.

Another feature that can be added to the amusements of this place is suiffishing-with line and seine-in which a considerable amount of sport can be induiged in.
