- -Fun and playful design that caters to the site chosen by the designer
- -Inspires the feeling of surprise and delight for the user

Awards

- -\$250 Grand prize for each category
- -\$100 People's Choice award decided by the May FSDA lecture attendees
- -Honorable mention prizes awarded by jury

Submission Requirements

Single 24"x36" PDF (5 MB maximum file size) or hand drawing containing

- -Drawings
- -Concept rendering
- -Short paragraph explaining your design
- -Design must hold at least 25 books
- -Design must be able to accommodate a Little Free Library charter sign
