Categories

Architectural Design

- Distinctive architectural style inspired by the assigned site (4221 Dakota Dr., San Diego)
- Address the specific environment

Whimsical Design

- Fun and playful design that caters to the site chosen by the designer
- Inspires the feeling of surprise and delight for the user

Awards

- \$250 Grand prize for each category
- \$100 People's Choice award decided by the May FSDA lecture attendees
- Honorable mention prizes awarded by jury

Important Dates

- April 1: Submissions due
- April 15: Winners announced
- May 20: Winning designs on display

Submission Requirements

- Single 24"x36" PDF (5 MB maximum file size) or hand drawing containing
- Drawings
 - Concept rendering
 - Short paragraph explaining your design
 - Design must hold at least 25 books
 - Design must be able to accommodate a Little Free Library charter sign
