Chair McCullough, Historical Resources Board (HRB) members, & staff,

<u>Item 11: Mission Valley Community Plan Update</u> – The HRB is being asked to recommend adoption of the Mission Valley Historic Context Statement and Cultural Resources Constraints Analysis to the City Council. However, using historical maps and images as documentary evidence, the sensitivity map within the Constraints Analysis should be expanded to "high sensitivity" around the San Diego Mission de Alcalá to include the areas that were once the gardens and agricultural fields for the Mission. Although the archaeological record and Kumeyaay tribe consultation are stated not support this change, clearly there is other documentary evidence that does support this modification, and all resources should be used in order to make the most informed decision.

The map at the link below illustrates the various tracts of land belonging to the Mission San Diego in 1860, which includes an olive orchard and garden area.
