A YEAR IN REVIEW

***** PROJECTS ****

Historic Neighborhood

We have just finished our Architectural District Guidline, and will be presenting this to all the owners who attend a meeting Wed. at 1929 Front, for the purpose of submitting the final draft before City Planning. Meanwhile we work on with owners, and the Historic Sites Board, to save this neighborhood as a unique place in our city. This will be an uphill fight.

Horton Hotel

Mr. Ed Scott, the most phenomenal worker on this preservation attempt, in liason with SOHO, now is working with City officials on the resolution of the submitted Planned District proposal for the block containing the Horton, the Balboa and the Off-Broadway. This is another up-hill battle.

Christian House

We now intend, and have already been working with the Cultural Heritage Committee, to move both the Christian House and the Burton House (Diabetes Assoc. Headquarters) to Heritage Park. We are also working with the Committee to find other structures worthy of preservation in an effort to move all at once in a "parade of houses" in time for the Bi-Centennial.

SOHO TOURS

Our fantastic Tours have now brought us the reputation of San Diego's historic "Tour Guides", a reputation well-deserved. More Tours are planned for Fall and next year, including Coronado.

Fund-Raising

With all the projects we are now into this year will see more fantastic events sponsored by SOHO to raise all the money we'll need to save as many structures as we hope to in the near future.

*****Financial Report****

We started our year with little money and in need of everything! Our first event, the Downtown Block Party grossed about \$2500.00 and we soon followed this with our highly successful December Tours. Spring saw more April Tours and our Annual Train Trip to Los Angeles. The Train Trip along grossed \$750.00 (more than anticipated) and then more touring to end the year with our Queen Victoria's Birthday Party and Walking Tour. All together this year SOHO Tour Guides grossed upwards of \$8700.00. Also our new Commemorative glassware on first appearance brought in about \$400.00 at one event. We also brought in about \$100.00 through SOHO slide lectures, a free SOHO service to organizations.

Out of this we were able to print up slides, membership forms, membership cards, open a separate Tour account and an Historic Neighborhood account, and print up two brochures, one on the walking Tour
