LA JOLLA COTTAGES NAMED HISTORIC SITES

The city's Historic Site Board designated two turn-of-the-century cottages, overlooking La Jolla Cove, as historic sites on Friday, January 6.

By a 10-2 vote, the board decided that the two 1890's cottages, known as the "Red Rest" and "Red Roost," have significant architectural value worth preserving. The cottages are located at 1179 and 1187 Coast Blvd.

Jack Heimburge, owner of the property, told the board he is ready to build a 17-unit, three-story apartment complex on the site and advocated moving the cottages to another location for preservation. He said anyone wanting the cottages could have them for free.

SOHO member, Tony Ciani who represents La Jollans opposed to demolition of the cottages, said if they were moved or torn down the entire architectural atmosphere surrounding the cove would have been lost.

A subcommittee has been appointed to investigate how the sites may be preserved, with either city or private funds.

SOHO is backing preservation of these cottages. A special account has been opened to handle donations for this preservation. Checks must be made payable as follows, SOHO/Red Rest and Red Roost.

The San Diego Historical Society is sponsoring a couse entitled, THE HISTORY OF SAN DIEGO: FROM MISSION AND PRESIDIO TO METROPOLIS. The course is offered through the Extension Division of San Diego State University. Classes will be held at the Villa Montezuma.

Dr. David J. Weber, Professor of History at San Diego State will lecture on the period from 1769 to 1846.

Dr. Clare B. Crane will lecture on San Diego's history from the 1850's to present. Dr. Crane is a SOHO Board Member, member of the Historic Site Board and until recently was Curator and Education Director of the Villa Montezuma.

CORONADO NEWS

Coronado citizens jammed a City Council public hearing January 7 to fight for the preservation of Ocean Boulevard's mansion row.

As a result, the council -opposing a city Planning Commission
recommendation -- voted unanimously
to deny an application by a developer
to build a cooperative structure of
eight dwelling units at 1043 Ocean
Blvd.

The developer said the intended to construct "a mansion" repeating the architecture of the Dupee House at 1015 Ocean Blvd. The Dupee House, a Coronado landmark and considered to the the largest single-family residence on the island with 27 bedrooms, was built in the early 1900's by S.W. Hebbard and Irving Gill. The Dupee house is of English Tudor-type design.
