

- 2. It is rich in historical, architectural, and aesthetic significance as part of its urban environment.

- 4. The Club is a definite asset to future downtown redevelopment and also to marina development.
- 5. It is the last waterfront building of its type in the San Diego area.



On October 4th, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., SOHO is hosting a home tour at the historic Victorian structures in National City. On this Saturday, eight buildings will be open, including the historic Brick Row, St. Matthews Episcopal Church, the George Webster House, the Granger Music Hall, the Museum of American Treasures, the Depot Restaurant, and the two houses built by the Kimball brothers, who founded National City. Other buildings along the bus route will be pointed out by tour guides.

The focal point of the tour will be the 900 block of "A" Avenue, where the street will be blocked off for a bazaar. Beer, wine, sandwiches and ice cream will be offered for delectable munching, and you may also purchase plants, works of art and Victorian artifacts from SOHO's personal memorabilia collection.

There will be a slide show and lecture on the history of National City at Kimball Hall. Free coffee, lemonade and cookies will be served.

Tickets are \$5.00 per person, \$3.00 for students 18 years and under, and may be purchased on the day of the tour at the tour center on "A" Avenue. Proceeds will be used for the restoration of Granger Music Hall and on-going SOHO preservation projects.

<u>Directions</u>: Take Highway 5 South to 8th Street turnoff. Turn right on 8th to National Avenue. Turn right on National to 9th. Turn left on 9th - go for one block to "A" Avenue. We'll see you there! This should be a fantastic community-involved tour! Don't miss it.
