GOV. BROWN SIGNS PRESERVATION DIRECTIVE

California Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr., signed an Executive Order protecting that state's "unique and irreplaceable" cultural resources March 6. 


BANK OF COMMERCE BUILDING



WEST ELEVATION

THE BANK OF COMMERCE BUILDING, DESIGNED BY J.B. STANNARD WAS BUILT IN 1888, DURING THE SAN DIEGO BOOM YEARS. THIS FOUR-STORY COMMERCIAL FACADE EXEMPLIFIES THE RICHNESS OF APPLIED QRNAMENT IN THE ITALIAN BRACK-ETED STYLE WITHIN, A SKYLIGHTED SHAFT ALLOWED LIGHT TO PENETRATE TO THE SECOND LEVEL AS THE BUILDING HAD EXTERIOR EXPOSURE ON THE FRONT AND REAR SURFACES ONLY. THE SYMMETRICAL FACADE OF CUT STONE HAS TWO DECORATED FRAME BAY PROJECTIONS THE ELEGANCE OF THIS FACADE CONTRASTS SHARPLY WITH THE ROBUST ROMANESQUE-LIKE FACADE OF THE NESMITH-GREELY BUILDING (CAL-1971), ADJACENT TO IT.

SOHO is a non-profit California Corporation, and holds General Meetings approximately every three to four months, always at a different historic locale. (In the past, we have met at the San Diego Hotel, at Heritage Park, at the San Diego Rowing Club, etc.) These General Meetings are always publicized well in advance in the Newsletter.
