NATIONAL PRESERVATION WEEK

In celebration of National Preservation Week, SOHO has planned a gala event on Saturday, May 8, 1982.

Beginning at 9:00 a.m. and again at 1:00 p.m., bus tours of San Diego shall originate at Heritage Park and cover such historic areas as The Gaslamp District, Golden Hill, and Banker's Hill. The tours will include visits to the Backesto Building and the St. Louis Bank of Commerce Building in Gaslamp; the Quartermass-Wilde and Frost houses in Golden Hill and the Britt-Scripps House in Banker's Hill.

Walking tours of Heritage Park will also be conducted throughout the day.

At 11:30 a.m. the Community College Bank, a 50 piece ensemble will play a collection of music designed to make your day in Heritage Park completely enjoyable.

County Supervisors Jim Bates and Roger Hedgecock are also scheduled to make presentations and announcements of preservation in our community.

So come early, bring a picnic lunch and enjoy a day of preservation news, music and fun in Heritage Park!



Planning Seminar Set for November

The American Association for State and Local History will be holding a seminar entitled, "Successful Interpretive Planning" November 7-13, 1982, hosted by the San Diego Historical Society and Old Town State Park. The registration fee is \$250 and the application deadline is September 7, 1982.

The six day seminar will help mid-level historical agency professionals upgrade their interpretive skills. Each will begin with an introduction to museums as settings for interpretation. Instructor-led sessins will deal with planning, implementing, and evaluating a variety of interpretive programs, including exhibits, school programs and adult programs. Special attention will be given to research methods and resources, effective communication of the interpretive message, and training and motivation of interpretative staff.

SOHO Plans Riverside Mission Inn Dinner Theater Overnight Tour

The Mission Inn in Riverside is truly one of the treasurers of America, reflecting the opulence and grandeur of another era. Its creator, the late Frank Miller, was himself a remarkable person. Did he fancy himself as the reincarnation of Father Serra? We do not know, but he did enjoy wearing the garb of a padre and he was a builder. The Mission Inn became his monument to the California Mission System... an incredibly romantic, ornate and intriguing synthesis of a mission system that existed only in his mind's eye.

Whatever it is, it isn't boring! People are enchanted by it and have that eerie feeling that they have somehow seen it before. Chances are, they have; for it is often used as a setting for movies and t.v. stories. Presidents and celebrities aplenty have stayed at this place.

A few years ago, the Mission Inn looked as though it would become another casualty of the wrecking ball. Fortunately, a caring new owner rescued it and began the loving task of restoring it to its original elegance.

On May 22-23, 1982 SOHO members and friends will have an opportunity to stay overnight at the Mission Inn. In addition to this overnight stay, the two day trip will include a tour of the Mission Inn, dinner at the Mission Inn Dinner Theater (Saturday night) for the production of Rogers and Hammersteins musical "Carousel" and an architectural tour of Riverside. The tour will leave San Diego about 8:30 a.m. on Saturday morning and will return to San Diego about 4:30 on Sunday afternoon. Cost of the tour will be \$68 for SOHO members and \$78 for non members. SOHO Schedules Victorian Bus Tour in San Diego for May 8, 1982

edition of "Westways" magazine. It also seems that many exciting unplanned events also happen to the delighted SOHO members that seem to be planned just for them.




La Mesa Cannonball Rides Again
