HORTON GRAND SADDLERY HOTEL

HRESIDENT'S

On Saturday Feb 2nd at 2p.m. SOHO will hold a General Meeting. The Senator Hotel's Bristol Restaurant will be the site. This structure has considerable interest to SOHO as we have just taken a facade easement on the structure.

This wonderfully restored building is listed on the National Register of Historic Sites and is located directly south of the new Federal Building and next door to the exclusive condo project, the Meridian.

SOHO will be honoring those people who helped save Horton Plaza and will also be conducting mini walking tours of historic Gaslamp District to view two more facade easements which SOHO has just taken. Refreshments will be served at the Bristol Restaraunt, so come early and enjoy the show.

COUNCIL OKS BONDS FOR DOWNTOWN HOTEL

The City Council on 11-20-84 agreed to issue up to \$9 million historical rehabilitation bonds for the construction of a downtown hotel that will include original materials from the Horton Grand and Kahle Saddlery Hotels. The new hotel will be at 4th and Island near the Gaslamp Quarters.

According to documents, the city faces no fiscal liability for the bonds.

issue The bond includes a 1 oan agreement between the city and Bank of America and indenture-of-trust agreement between the city and Security Pacific National Bank. The interest cost to the developer, Horton Grand Sadderly Hotel, is projected at 11.5 percent over a 30 year

period.
