COME JOIN US IN RANCHO SANTA FE

As mentioned in our previous newsletter, SOHO will host a walking tour of Rancho Santa Fe on Saturday, April 25. A panel discussion, beginning at 1:00 p.m., devoted to the history, architecture and planning of this historic community will precede the tour. A late afternoon winetasting featuring 10 premier wineries of the Southland will be held at the Inn at Rancho Santa Fe after the tour from 4:30-6:00 p.m.

his event is a departure from HO's traditional home tours. Over the past year, SOHO has found itself fighting the preservation battle to save the Balboa Theater, Chinese Buildings, the Plunge just to name a few landmarks, and not to mention the numerous individual homes and neighborhoods. Given this hostile climate, SOHO decided to step back and reexamine our modus operandi.

This year's tour focuses on the planning process and how that helps to achieve preservation of communities and neighborhoods. Hence, we decided to concentrate upon Rancho Santa Fe as a case study. How has this community withstood the tremendous pressures—growth and development—that have compromised and/or threatened virtually every other Southern Californian community?

Our panel will discuss the history of the area and how, from the very beginning, planning and respect for the environment, governed the design of the community. We will also learn about the planning and zoning tools available to

assist in the preservation of historic buildings and how boards and commissions play an integral role in the enforcement of sensitive design of new buildings and maintenance of older structures.

In planning for a particular architectural style, Spanish Colonial Revival, Lilian Rice, the architect, designed the Civic Center as the heart of Rancho Santa Fe and the model for homes and other buildings throughout the community. The walking tour will concentrate upon the Civic Center and how it has retained (or lost) its original appearance. Each tour participant will receive a booklet including a map, a description and a history of each building. Participants are encouraged to follow the route at their leisure, but guides will be provided for those people who prefer a formal

Upon completion of the tour, weary participants may refresh themselves with a glass of wine and light hors d'ouevres at the charming Inn at Rancho Santa Fe.




