LANDMARKS OF DEMOCRACY

During 1987, we will celebrate a remarkable milestone-the 200th anniversary of the foundation of American government, the United States Constitution. And this year, National Historic Preservation Week, May 10-16, 1987 will be a part of this grand celebration. Under the theme "Landmarks of Democracy," preservationists everywhere will organize events to call attention to historic buildings and sites that symbolize the liberties and opportunities to achieve that are afforded all Americans by our democratic form of government.

Come join in SOHO's celebration of Preservation Week 1987 by attending the annual People In Preservation Awards on Thursday, May 14 from 5:30-8:00 p.m. at the Old Spaghetti Factory on Fifth Avenue at "K" Street. Each year SOHO honors those individuals who have contributed significantly to the preservation cause. If our 1987 award winners are any indication, now more than ever, preservation is an integral part of the San Diego scene. SOHO is granting awards to residential and commercial rehabilitations, craftspeople, neighborhood activists, planners and even a local councilperson. The award winners are as follows:

Residential Restoration: Margaret Elliot for her sensitive restoration of the Irving Gill designed Mary Cossitt house #7.

Maritime Restoration: Todd Schwede for his faithful restoration of the Bagheera, a racing schooner.

Commercial Restoration: Don and Bill Haynsworth and Rip Fleming for their adaptive reuse of the Windsor Hotel.

Craftsmanship: Norm Hasenfung and Chip Melvin for their exemplary skills displayed in the restoration of the Amy Strong house.

Neighborhood Preservation: Save Mission Beach Park Committee for their continual campaign to save Mission Beach Amusement Park.

Preservation Action: Steve Karo for his incessant efforts to preserve the Balboa Theater as a legitimate theater space.

Preservation Awareness: Betty McManus and Lynn Schubert for their production of Silver Gate Concerts, chamber music in historic places.

Preservation Planning: City of Oceanside for its development of the San Luis Rey Historic District.

Civic: Councilmember Abbe Wolfsheimer for her leadership on the San Diego City Council on preservation issues.

Preservationist of the Year: Tony Ciani, architect, for his years of dedication to and work for numerous preservation issues in San Diego.

Congratulations to all of the award winners, and congratulations to all of us, because San Diego County is a better place for their efforts!

PRESIDENT'S LETTER

During the month of February I was fortunate to have spent some time in one of my favorite cities, ris. On a visit in 1984, I had noticed the old "abandoned" Gare d'Orsay, a magnificent railway station located next to the Seine and designed by Victor Laloux. By February it had become the talk of the town and of the art world. Renamed Musee d'Orsay, it is the new home of nineteenth century French art and architecture.

It is exceedingly controversial in much the same way that the Eiffel Tower and Pompidou Center were and I.M. Pei's pyramid for the Louvre will likely become. Putting controversy aside, the building is standing, it remains useful and it houses masterpieces.

Paris is synonymous with great architecture. You might think that noone would miss Orsay. It was architectural historians and politicians (including two French presidents), however, who balked at mere idea of demolition. risians, having lost their beloved Les Halles in the 1970's, also voiced strong objections to the possible loss of Orsay.

Gare d'Orsay/Musee d'Orsay had a happy ending. Preservation triumphed and the new museum is an instant success.

Will our Balboa Theater be so lucky? Will our equivalents to Les Halles (the Klauber House, the Plunge, etc.), be the last victims of greed and visionless decisionmaking? Will our politicians ever learn to say no to the easy way out, demolition? Great cities don't just happen.

RANCHO SANTA FE TOUR HIGHLIGHTS


On April 25, SOHO hosted an enjoyable afternoon in the North County at Rancho Santa Fe. Members of the panel preceding the tour, enlightened the audience about the history of the community from prehistoric times through its development as a unique subdivision with a special planning process and restrictive design guidelines.

Rancho Santa Fe Historical Society members, Kerry Ridgeway, Sandy Sommerville and Tom Clotfelder served as guides for the tour of the "village" and civic center. Mr. Clotfelder also allowed tour participants to visit an unaltered Lilian Rice designed home.

Upon the completion of the tour, participants enjoyed a glass of wine and light hors d'oeuvres at the gracious Inn at Rancho Santa Fe. Ten wineries from the Southland poured their award winning wines. CHINESE/ASIAN THEMATIC HISTORIC DISTRICT

SOHO commends the San Diego Historical Sites Board for its decision on April 29, 1987 to designate a Chinese/Asian Thematic Historic District. The unique character of the remaining Chinese buildings within the district, and their history, from the early development of New Town San Diego are proof of the importance of preserving these special examples of our Asian past so integral in the growth and development of the City. SOHO especially congratulates former SOHO president, Carol Lindemulder for her years of work towards realizing this goal. Ms. Lindemulder previously placed two of the buildings within the district on the local landmarks register, served on the Ad Hoc Committee to assist with the designation of the proposed district and she is a member of the Historical Sites Board. Thank you, Carol for your assistance on this most worthy preservation project.
