SILVER GATE CONCERTS

We are looking forward to another delightful year of Sunday chamber music programs presented in historic landmarks.

Feb. 7, Sunday at 3:00 pm Works of Debussy, Ravel, and da Falla, will be performed by soprano Calo Plantamura, flutist Lynn Schubert, cellist Marcia Zeavin, and pianist Margaret Rose, in the 1910 Suros home built by Irving Gill at 1156 Isabella Ave., Coronado.

March 6, 1988 at 3:00 pm Italian and French Baroque music will be performed on period instruments by Trio Sonnerie, in San Diego Trust and Savings Bank, 530 Broadway. Built in 1928 by architect William Templeton Johnson, the bank is an outstanding example of Italian Romanesque Revival style featuring magnificent painted ceiling and spectacular marble work.

The April 10 concert will be at the Lafayettee Hotel, 2223 El Cajon Blvd, and the May 8 concert will be at the Chapel at Bishop's School, 7607 La Jolla Blvd., La Jolla.

PRESERVE THE 50'S & 60'S?

A new issue in preservationist circles is the rapid depletion of the nation's stock of 1950's and early 1960's buildings - structures that reflect the rise of the American middle class, the fascination with new technology, and the availability of leisure time.

A Jan. 4, 1988, article in the LA <u>Times</u> reports that a growing number of scholars, government officials and architects seek special landmark status for post-World War II structures, from a 25 yearold Berkeley Safeway to a '50s business district in Albuquerque's Nob Hill, and a 1957 Phillips 66 station, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright, near Duluth. Even a 1953 McDonald's in Downey is eligible for listing in the Nation-al Register of Historic Places.



SUMMER JOBS

This summer the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS) and the Historic American Engineering Record (HAER) will be conducting recording projects at various locations throughout the country. ETHNIC NEIGHBORHOOD TOUR

The Museum of Man has scheduled a tour of San Diego's Portuguese community for Saturday, January 30 at 9:30 am. Cost includes lunch and is \$22 for Museum members and \$25 for non-members. The Portuguese settled in San Diego over a hundred years ago and played a large role in our fishing industry.

QUINCE STREET BRIDGE

Elinor Meadows, a member of SOHO since 1971, is leading the campaign for the reconstruction and reopening of the Quince St. Bridge. The 1905 wooden bridge which is suffering from dry rot and termites has been closed for six months. The bridge provides a pedestrian walkway between Third and Fourth Ave., and is one of the very few remaining of its type in San Diego. It is a favorite of walkers and joggers as it provides a breath-taking view of San Diego Bay.

The City Engineering Office issed an evaluation report which indicated that repairs would cost \$90,000, and it would cost \$150,000 to demolish and build a new one. The report is now being reviewed by the Historical Site Board and by the Transportation and Land Use Committee. TLUC has tentatively scheduled a public hearing for Feb. 8. Reports and a conformation of the hearing may be obtained be calling the Transportation a Land Use secretary at 236-6589.

FACADE EASEMENT

coperties listed on the National Register of Historic Places are eligible to participate in the SOHO easement program. If a building is listed in the National Register as part of a district, the building must contribute to the character of the district. In the program, the owner of the property voluntarily transfers the facade easement, a property right, to SOHO. SOHO then ensures that the historical character of the building will remain in perpetuity, despite any changes in zoning or land 11 8 6 . The easement on a historic property donated to SOHO will qualify the donor for a charitable contribution and may also reduce the tax assessment on the property by restricting the highest and best use of the property to the current one.

SOHO currently administers five facade easements. A SOHO Committee on Facade Easements was established at the January Board Meeting. If you would like more information or would like to serve on the committee, please contact the SOHO office, 297-9327.

JULIA LIFFREING HOUSE

Development is threatening this important 1893 Queen Anne style home located on Hillside Ave. in El Cajon.

Karna Webster, a SOHO member, recently completed a preliminary historical report which emphasizes the significance of the Julia Liffreing House as one of the few large Victorian ranch houses still standing in the east county, as the home of a pioneer family, and as the work of an important San Diego architect, John B. Stannard. Although the structure today is vacant and boarded up, the house was built of redwood and is structurally sound.

Three years ago the San Diego Association of Governments included the home in a historic preservation inventory prepared for the city of El Cajon.

Mary Ann Ostermeyer, a local resident, is working to accumulate information and resources to convince the owners, who live in Monterey Park, to stop their plans to develop the property and tear down the structure. We add SOHO's support to these efforts.


The conference is co-hosted by the California Dept. of Commerce and will be held at the Westgate Hotel. Please contact NTHP or SOHO for additional information.

FIRSTSAN DIEGO COURTHOUSE GROUNDBREAKING

On Saturday, January 30, 1988, at 11:00 am, ground will be broken for the reconstruction of the Courthouse built in 1847 by members of the Mormon Battalion.

This was the first fired brick structure built in California. Masonry skills were thus transported from the mid-West by the soldiers.

The celebration is being staged by The First San Diego Courthouse, Inc, a California non-profit corporation organized in 1984 with the purpose of reconstructing San Diego's first civic building on its original site in Old Town San Diego Historic Park.

Members of the Mormon Battalion, Boy Scouts, the Marine Band, and docents dressed in period costume will add to the festivities.
