SOHO's most notable role has been that of preservation advocacy. Over the past two decades many of San Diego's cultural resources (landmarks, significant structures, and neighborhood character) have become threatened by insensitive development decisions. SOHO has defended some of San Diego County's most treasured resources against destruction.

SOHO - NOW MORE THAN EVER

I joined SOHO in 1980, and so have been along for almost half of the illustrious twenty years we are now preparing to celebrate. The proximate cause of my joining this organization was my purchase, with my long time partner Victoria, of a 1923 California bungalow in what was to become the Sherman Heights Historic District.

I still encourage people to "invest" in historic properties, as many of our members have and do, but it's not necessary to "qualify" at any lending institution to make this most important "investment".

Since 1969, the Save Our Heritage Organisation has served as forum and format for people of many backgrounds to make the investment of self in the crusade to recognize and save those elements of our designed and built environment that define our cities, towns, and countryside as special places.

In the past year SOHO has been involved with projects ranging from rural farm houses to urban industrial buildings, with sites dating from the earliest European contact to the "deco" days of the "flappers".

Our membership is no less broad in interest than our projects would suggest, and our board continues to reflect this diversity of background and focus. Board Meetings are on the first Monday of each month at 6:00 p.m., at Senlis cottage, Heritage Park: interested members are welcome.
