Train Tour Scheduled

SOHO is sponsoring a train trip and tour on April 21 to the Center for the Study of Decorative Arts in San Juan Capistrano. The tour will include a visit to the exhibition "California Collectors and Collectors II: Arts and Crafts Movement in California 1880—1918: Traditions and Antecedents." It features furniture, ceramics, metal works, lighting and textiles—all on loan from California collectors.

In one gallery, the influence of some important artisans — William Morris, Frank Lloyd Wright, Gustave Stickley and the Greene brothers — will be explained. In another gallery, rooms will be constructed in the style of the period, fully accessorized with arts and crafts pottery, lamps, rugs, paintings and photographs. Included will be some very special pieces on loan from the Greene and Greene masterpiece, the Gamble House of Pasadena, the collection of James and Janeen Marrin, also of Pasadena, and many other private collections.

Another highlight of the trip will be a lecture by noted professor Robert Winter of Occidental College. Winter, who is the author of **The California Bungalow**, will present a talk entitled "Hand, Head, Heart: The Arts and Crafts Movement in Southern California."

The train leaves from the Santa Fe depot in downtown San Diego at 8:05 A.M. Participants have the option of

returning on a train at either 1:59 P.M. or 3:58 P.M.

Reservations for the tour are required and must be made by April 2. Cost is \$55.00 for SOHO members, \$65.00 for others. Call SOHO now at 297-9327 to reserve your space!

The cost includes train tickets, exhibition and lecture charges, and a catered picnic lunch.

Reflections

From the President...

Two years ago when we first learned of the threat to the Savage Tire/Aztec Brewery complex in Barrio Logan we did not know if we would be able to protect this National Register eligible site from its planned destruction.

However, we did know that whatever the fate of these buildings might be the city's economic development staff must learn that historic and cultural resource management could be a valuable component of its revitalization plans, and that existing incentives (and protections) should (and must) be integrated into its efforts.

So it is with great dismay we see city staff discount facade easements as unworkable because the city would be "unwilling to accept fiscal liability." Facade easements are on of the most attractive preservation tools available, generating income for preservation groups and profits for developers of historic properties while assuring protection of significant sites.

On January 30, The Daily Transcript ran a front page article on the benefits of historic easements to urban developers. This stuff isn't hidden away!

The economic feasibility report also dismisses property tax abatement, citing the need for state-level legislation. Such legislation (The Mills Act) already exists! And SOHO referred to it in its responses to the draft EIR (Environmental Impact Report) but the city missed it. We, of course, have (patiently) continued to keep city stainformed.

By the time you have received this issue of Reflections, the San Diego City Council will have had another opportunity to consider the issuance of a coastal development (i.e. demolition) permit for this site. While it would be a shame to lose these wonderful buildings under any circumstances, to lose them because a complete analysis had not been done with city staff unaware, unwilling, or unable, would be intolerable.

Mission Brewery Dedicated

On February 14, in a brief ceremony before a gathering of city officials and community and preservation leaders, Congressman Bill Lowery placed a bronze plaque on the Mission Brewery, designating it a national historic site. In his remarks, Lowery congratulated Foote Development for the company's sensitivity in balancing the restoration of the Mission Brewery with the development of the adjacent Mission Brewery Plaza office complex. One of the Plaza is scheduled to open for occupancy in April. Among the attendees at the dedication were SOHO board members Corey Braun, Kathleen Kelley-Markham, Suzanne Lawrence, David Swarens and Robin Webster and executive director Al Alferos.

Earthquake Seminar Held

On March 1, some 45 concerned attendees participated in a daylong seminar that touched on earthquake preparedness, building codes and regional issues. The seminar was presented by California Preservation Foundation. Staffer Liz Morton welcomed the group on behalf of the Foundation and SOHO president David Swarens made brief seminar-opening remarks on behalf of SOHO, a local co-sponsor. Presenters included Ron Buckley of the City's Planning Department and Thomas Tobin, executive director of the California Seismic Safety Commission in Sacramento. Tobin, who still has relatives in the San Diego area, grew up in El Cajon and attended Grossmont High School. A UC Berkeley graduate, he now resides in Mill Valley. In his talk he cautioned that in 30 years from now most of the fine brick-built buildings probably will be destroyed or lost due to earthquakes.
