National Trust and 'Christmas in April' alliance to advance housing rehabilitation

The National Trust for Historic Preservation has announced that it has established a partnership with the Christmas in April, a volunteer group specializing in housing rehabilitation, much of it done in historic neighborhoods.

A letter from National Trust president Richard Moe notes that the missions of the two organizations pursue the same goals and encounter similar challenges. "Just as the National Trust is the leader of the national preservation movement, Christmas in April is the leading volunteer organization in housing rehabilitation in America," Moe says. It is hoped that this partnership will help support the work of historic preservation groups and enhance their outreach with community groups.

The national office of Christmas in April provides assistance and supports to 155 affiliates in 44 states. In 1995, 130,000 volunteers rehabilitated 4,000 houses, many in historic neighborhoods, in 380 cities and towns. San Diego is listed as a participating city.

Low-income, elderly helped

According to Christmas in April figures, some five and a half million low-income homeowners in America are elderly, and the vast majority are women. Over one-third live alone, and 43% spend over 40% of their income on housing expenditures.

Twenty-two percent of all Americans are shelter poor, meaning they cannot afford basic minimum necessities after paying housing costs.

Therein lies the paradox: they have a home but cannot afford to maintain it. With volunteers eager to help, Christmas in April fills a desperate need, revitalizing neighborhoods as well as rehabilitating houses. President's Report



As you have probably seen and heard the Chollas Heights Radio Towers are now truely....'history.' Driven by modern housing needs the Navy identified the historic site as one that must have rows of dwelling units. SOHO participated in the process of mitigation for the loss of significant features and came to a compromise with the Navy, the National Advisory Council,

the State Historic Preservation Office and the local planning group to preserve parts of the site and assemble them in an historic district that interprets this valuable technological history.

The project agreed on by all is now in its very preliminary stage. We will continue to be a partner in this process until the dream is realized and the promises are honored.

M. Wayne Donaldson, F.A.I.A.

Being named 1995 Preservationist of the Year by the California Preservation Foundation (CPF) is the latest in a long list of honors to be bestowed on architect M. Wayne Donaldson, a longtime SOHO member and head of the downtown architectural firm which bears his name. Let's take a look at this busy and interesting person who can always find the time to lend a hand to SOHO projects.

Donaldson is recognized as a leader in historic restoration and adaptive reuse of existing structures and his knowledge unites the nineteenth century building methods with the state-of -the-art twentieth century construction technologies.

The experience with space age technology, interlaced with his commitment to the preservation of the environment has produced outstanding diverse built structures

such as Earth Force, Poly Pods, Biostructure and Pneu, projects receiving national and international acclaim.

Over the last 17 years, Donaldson has originated several seismic strengthening innovations for historical buildings. Working with the State Office of Historic Preservation and the California Safety Commission, he rewrote archaic building definitions and drafted seismic ordinances. 1990, CPF acknowledged Donaldson for his statewide leadership in the interpretation of the State Historical Building Code which allowed the rehabilitation of historic buildings for affordable single room occupancy hotels.

In addition to SOHO, Donaldson has been involved with

many local and national historic preservation organizations including the San Diego Historical Society and the National Trust for Historic Preservation. He is past chairman of the Gaslamp Quarter Council, and the advisory board to the Redevelopment Agency. He is currently vice-chair of the State Historic Building Code Board, and past president of CPF.

San Diego area projects

Donaldson's work can be seen and appreciated throughout the County. Projects include the Horton Grand Hotel, San Diego Hardware, Windsor Hotel, The Soap Factory, Aerospace Museum and the House of Hospitality in Balboa Park, Olivenhain Town Hall, Guajome Ranch, Leo Carrillo Ranch,

and the Americanization School in Oceanside.

Donaldson - A personal view

Donaldson was born in Camp Lejeune, North Carolina and raised in Oceanside. He and his wife, Nancy Ann, and daughter, Erica Lynn, live in Mission Hills in a 1924 Bungalow. Donaldson is a accomplished pilot and often flies his own airplane on business trips. His longest trips has been to Sacramento and Flagstaff, Arizona.

If not a career in architecture he said he would probably be into restoring classic and warbird aircraft, scuba diving, camping and construction projects.

When asked what sparked his interest in historic preservation and restoration, especially when sometimes it seems so much easier and economical to demolish a structure and start from scratch, Donaldson replied, "Having had the chance to study in Uppsala, Sweden, and remembering walking up marble stairs to classes in a building built back in the thirteenth century...and experiencing the splendor of the spaces where so much history had taken place."

"Demolishing a historic structure is destroying the chronicles of time. No dollar amount can be put on experiencing spaces built by craftsman and techniques long since shelved to the history museums. Buildings are the only visual links to history."

As for his vision of San Diego, Donaldson replied, "the entire City of San Diego is a Historic District and the reconstruction of the San Diego Presidio."

Paradise Valley Hospital adds Orchid to its PIP Award

Paradise Valley Hospital's historic Egyptian arch was recently honored as one of the best architectural creations in San Diego County by the Orchids & Onions contest that annually recognizes the best (and worst) in local design projects. The hospital also received the Civic Jewel Award at SOHO's People In Preservation event in May.

The arch, rebuilt in 1994 as part of the hospital's 90th anniversary celebration, was granted an Orchid for its community enhancing and visually appealing design. sited on the corner of Eighth Street and Euclid Avenue in National City.


The original arch was built an an entryway to the hospital in the late 1920's, when Egyptian-style architecture was very popular in San Diego. However, it was torn down in 1956 when the access

road it served was closed.

In 1994, Paradise Valley Hospital staff and local historians worked together to recreate the modern-day arch as faithful to the original design as possible. It was built at the same site as the original and even has the same wording as the original: "Paradise Valley Sanitarium." original arch was made of solid poured concrete: the recreated version is built with a plaster base poured over a wooden frame.
